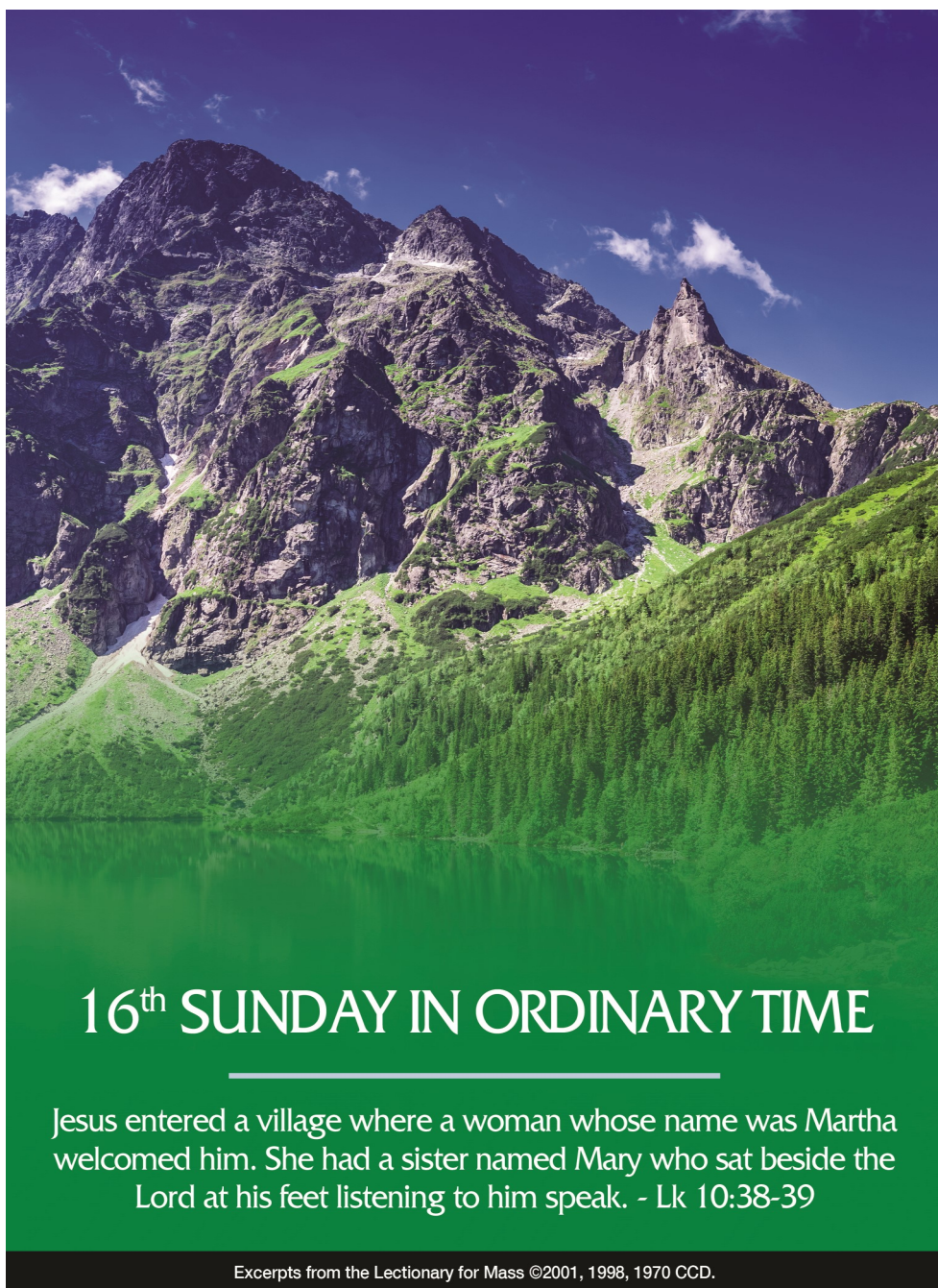

In regards to the stained glass windows, much has already been completed but there is still much more to do. All of the sixteen tall stained glass windows have been cleaned inside and out. New protective glass has been installed on the exterior now with little vent holes in the panels. This allows for ventilation of air in-between the protective glass and the stained glass itself. Prior to this point, moisture was building up between the old protective glass and the stained glass running the risk of greater damage. Fortunately, it had not reached the point where the damage was severe or even irreparable. With the new vented protective glass, the windows will be better protected which will ensure the preservation of the beauty of our stained glass windows.

There were some panels in the windows that had broken glass. These have been removed and the contractors have taken them to their studio in order to make the repairs. They also have to complete the repairs on several of the upper and lower panels that are meant to open to provide ventilation inside the church. When they return, they will complete the process. They also need to complete the initial project for which they were hired which was to restore the windows in the sacristies.

Some parishioners have noticed the yellowish hue in much of the stained glass windows. They were surprised that it did not go away when the windows were cleaned. Honestly, it took me a little bit by surprise as well. I had thought that the windows had faded into that color due to dirt and age. On the contrary, our contractors pointed out to me that the yellowish hue was a part of the original color in the stained glass. This is the reason why there is still a yellowish shade to many of the window panels.

Some of have also noticed that the two trees were removed from the east side of church. The two evergreen trees had grown so tall and were butting up right next to the side of the church and two of the stained glass windows. The workers needed to have enough space to do the necessary work on the exterior of the windows. After some consultation, it was decided to allow the workers to cut off whatever branches they needed to remove in order to give them the space needed. However, there were a couple of unexpected results which led me to the decision to have them cut down.

For one, the two trees became practically bare on one side. After more investigating, it was determined that the trees had run the risk of being too heavy on one side. During the winter when snow and ice might build up on the remaining branches, it would have caused the risk of the trees falling over onto the parking lot from the unevenly distributed weight. Hearing this, I did not want to take the risk of the trees falling on top of anyone's cars or, worse, on top of anyone and causing damage or injury.

Secondly, we also discovered that while the outer layer of the trees looked lush and green, the center of the trees had actually become extremely dry. I was told that this could have created a fire hazard because the dry branches could easily catch on fire. Again, with the trees being right in front of two stained glass windows, I did not want to take the chance of a spark of flame coming into church from one of the opened panels and creating more damage.

Down the line, I would like to take one of those areas from the felled trees and create an outdoor shrine/memorial. At this time, I am thinking of creating a space where we can remember and pray for the victims of any crime against life—abortion, war, senseless violence, etc. This is in the works.

Overall, parishioners have been pleased with the look of the stained glass windows. I myself have become more and more amazed at how vibrant the colors are now in every scene depicted and how much more natural light has been coming into the worship space. But, there is much more to do.

We still have the rose window on the south elevation as well as the smaller windows near and in the sanctuary. We currently have the funding to complete ten out of the sixteen stained glass windows. Our Summer Collection together with the parishioner who will make the matching gift will hopefully give us enough funds to complete all of the windows. I have taken somewhat of a risk in telling the contractors to finish all of the sixteen tall stained glass windows before we got the funds. But, I am confident that we will together be able to accomplish this goal and complete all of the windows in church and give ourselves as much as possible in order to pay off some bills.

CYCLES OF FAITH

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Active and contemplative. At work and at rest. These are dynamics we all face in our lives, and if we're honest, we might not always balance perfectly! In this Sunday's Gospel, our daily tensions play out in two sisters. Mary "sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak." Martha, on the other hand, is "burdened with much serving." This, as it turns out, is not necessarily "the better part."

All of us reading this have some sort of labor we engage in. We have different trades or careers. We have responsibilities as family members, some of which may take up most of our time. In the time of Scripture, showing hospitality to guests was one of the most important values in society. Our work is important. Jesus himself spent decades as a carpenter. So what's the problem with Martha? Martha is burdened, anxious, and worried. Not only that, but she resents her sister's choice. "Tell her to help me," she demands of Jesus.

How easy it is to get very busy doing good things. We need to provide for our families and plan for retirement. We need to make sure children are clothed, fed, and educated. Our committees, ministries, and sports schedules need to stay on track. However, without a balance of work with rest, without contemplation in the midst of our action, we will miss the point. While many parts are required for our life in the world to function, the better part is our relationship with God. This week, make time in your busy schedule to sit at Jesus' feet. Maybe this is 20 minutes with Scripture, participating in a daily Mass, or a quiet walk alone in the park. Receive what Christ wants to speak to you.
