In a couple of weeks, we will have our First Parish Session as part of the Renew My Church process. This will take place on Sunday, September 15th in the Activity Center immediately after the 10:30 a.m. Mass. It should not go longer than an hour and a half at the most. ALL are encouraged and invited.

During this conversation we will continue to pray about our future as a parish community together with the other parishes in our grouping. We will also review what are our strengths and what are the greatest challenges we face as one parish among many others. We will also use this as an opportunity to answer questions with information that is currently available.

I am sure that even at this point any one of us can list a good number of strengths and gifts that our parish possesses. Perhaps top on the list would be our facilities. Among the parishes in our grouping, ours would be the largest worship space that can accommodate the most number of people.

Of course, in addition to our worship space, we have the Activity Center. I have seen jaws drop as new visitors come and see the space for the first time. Parishioners and even non-parishioners all seem to want to use it for all sorts of events and activities. The Activity Center has become an asset.

Fortunately for us, our school building is being occupied and used by NCA who has assumed much of the responsibility for the upkeep of that building. So not only do we have a Catholic school present on campus but we no longer have had to deal with the demands of running our own parochial school.

Furthermore, our parking lots have also been a cause of envy whenever visitors come to us. In a day and age when people are no longer walking to church, it is truly a blessing to have as many parking lots as we do especially in a city parish such as ours.

Of course, our greatest strength would be all of you who fill the pews each week. We would not be a parish without a faithful community calling this place a spiritual home. We are diverse and vibrant. We are committed and generous. We are our greatest asset.

However, there are still the challenges. I am not trying to rain on anyone's parade but we also have to face reality. The greatest gift of a community oftentimes can become its own greatest weakness. We have five (5) major structures (church, rectory, school, convent, Activity Center) not to mention the garage structure and the boiler room. The finances required to take care of a large number of facilities is A LOT. It is similar with the expense of owning a home. Larger homes naturally require larger expenses and it is no different with large buildings such as the ones we have.

As I have mentioned on other occasions, the greatest challenge that faces us as a community is our inability to keep up with the ordinary expenses of running a parish of our size. As vibrant as it is, our faith community is no longer as large as it once was. Smaller numbers in people in the pews oftentimes means that the regular Sunday collection is impacted. As generous as people have been to projects such as our stained glass windows, we still come up drastically short when it comes to meeting our ordinary expenses. Our financial woes continue to be our greatest challenge.

For us on a local level, the question becomes what is better for our continued survival? If we keep going the way we are going, we will definitely run ourselves into the ground sooner than we may hope. With that in mind, what would be better? Do we downsize? Do we join forces with the other parishes and form one large faith community? These are the difficult questions we must ask and this is the reality that we are facing. If we come to the Parish Session on September 15th with the idea that we are striving to maintain the status quo, it is guaranteed that it will be a painful process. But, if we come with a prayerful spirit of how we can best respond to the needs of all of God's People in the West Ridge area, then we will be able to journey through this together and together celebrate God's grace.

RCIA and the Search for God

Are you searching for God? Do you, or someone you know, feel a calling toward the Catholic Church?

RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults – is a program for adults who are considering entering the Catholic Church or for baptized Catholics who wish to complete the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Eucharist and Confirmation). We also welcome Catholics who would like to study their faith more deeply.

In RCIA, we talk about the presence of God in our lives and in the world. We share our faith and pray. We study Scripture and how it relates and speaks to us today. We learn about the Church, its beliefs, and its sacraments. We explore what it means to be Catholic and to live a Christian life. We learn from each other as we journey together on a pilgrimage of faith.

RCIA sessions will take place on Monday from 7:00 p.m. until 8:15 p.m. in McCarthy Hall (7325 N. Claremont Avenue). The introductory class meets on Monday, September 9. RCIA culminates with the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 11, 2020.

If you have been contemplating entering the Church or completing your Sacraments of Initiation, please consider RCIA. Or you may know someone who has inquired about the Church or has not completed the Sacraments of Initiation. Spread the good news!

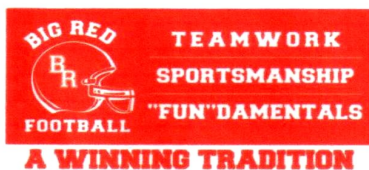

CYCLES OF FAITH

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Can you imagine if Jesus threw a party? From the wedding feast at Cana, we know he wouldn't let the wine run out. From this Sunday's Gospel, we know there would be quite a lively array of guests! We also knew who the most important people would be — everyone. Jesus advises throwing a party that turns everything upside down. Everyone should assume they're the least important attendee, and the guest list shouldn't include the neighborhood "who's who." Rather, we should go looking for "*the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind*" and hope they RSVP. Jesus describes a particular posture towards our own hospitality.

Parties are about the other people. "*Do not recline at table in the place of honor.*" How often can small talk become a one-upmanship of job promotions, home renovations, and our children's achievements? We've all been to parties where being the most interesting guest is the highest achievement. Yet so often, we know the best party guests are the ones who listen well to our stories. Whether we are guests or hosts, we have the opportunity to look on others with humility and awe.

Parties are opportunities to serve. Jesus advises us to be careful who we invite "*in case they might invite you back and you have repayment.*" Does Jesus literally mean we shouldn't invite our friends over? Of course not! But he does invite us to special consideration when we offer hospitality. When we invite people over to our home, what motivates us? Who we want to spend time with? Who we'd like to impress? These ultimately have only ourselves in mind. How about asking: Who could use some extra care right now? Who could benefit from a fun evening out? In other words, who can I serve?
